





Formerly 'The Grim Truth': Continuing under a New Title

As a preface to my continuing series on magical education, I must address a distasteful subject in the same manner in which one disposes of any such waste: as expeditiously as possible. To say that the appearance of more useless mealy-mouthed rhetoric about hearts disturbs me is too strong a

statement - I am, rather, annoyed. When I chose to begin writing under the title of the Grim Truth, it was specifically to reach Sirius Black's readership - the same readership which had been absorbing his words for some time and, by so doing, had prepared themselves to act. Grandiloquence carries one as far as the river one must cross, but of what use is that journey unless one has the tools to build the bridge?

However, the author of the opposing text - whom I suspect to be, due to the use of such laughably populist terms as 'freedom fighters,' either a Ministry writer or a simpleton - makes a troublesomely useful point. Anyone may now write a Grim Truth, which, while splendidly democratic, also incites vexatious debate about what the hallowed Sirius Black would have wanted. Therefore, continuing my publication under this journal <u>only</u>, I shall give it its own title: The Draught.

Those who have been courageous and enterprising enough to educate themselves through my writings are beginning to see their utility, and that is what I offer: utility. I will never offer you instructions which are false, or allow false instructions given by others to stand without being countered. I will never craft a method without considering your limited resources and safety. Finally, I will never waste your time with redundant, sentimental prose.

On the Practice of Occlumency - A Practical Guide

In consideration of the triviality with which personal privacy and the agency to withhold one's thoughts is treated in our time, Occlumency becomes a necessity against those who would purposefully invade the minds of others. Necessity being the mother of invention, the practice of Occlumency came to light in the thirteenth century during the Wizarding Inquisition of Stuttgart to counter the device of Legilimency. Legilimency is the art of sweeping aside the barrier between one's own mind and the mind of another. Conversely,

Occlumency was constructed to prevent such an intrusion.

Legilimency operates largely via the expedient of will, as does Occlumency. The reason why Legilimency is not a common practice is that the ability to lower the barrier between minds and gain the insight to interpret the resultant findings takes considerable time and practice to develop. Fortunately, Occlumency is more primitive than Legilimency, and, while still a significant undertaking, requires less time to actualise.

Those using Legilimency will be better able to do so if their target is vulnerable, exhausted, or in a similar state of disarmament. The first line of defense against Legilimency, then, is to avoid this state if at all possible. Most of the few practitioners of Legilimency require eye contact with their victim, though some have been known to accomplish it without. Thus, avoiding eye contact is the second line of defense.

When a Legilimens gains access to a mind, they are confronted by a barrage of emotions and memories, most of which will be associated with the event at hand. If their victim is attempting to conceal a truth, it is this truth which will be foremost in their thoughts - paradoxically, it is that which we endeavor to hide from others which we think about most often ourselves. That is why, in the practice of Occlumency, the ultimate goal is to be able to do what is often regarded as impossible: to <u>not</u> think of something. For instance, if I command you <u>not</u> to think of a black hippogriff, your first thought will likely be of a black hippogriff. Occlumency subverts this instinct and can, in its most refined form, turn this subversion into a useful weapon.

Occlumency, as with a great many other types of so-called "mind control" spells, is best achieved with practice. Since this practice is not possible in any situation other than the most undesirable, a set of exercises must take its place. This brings us to the third line of defense.

The most basic step to performing Occlumency is the practice of wiping the mind clean of any reactions, thoughts, emotions or associations. To think simply of nothing is not as straightforward as it might seem, so begin by meditating on one thing and one thing only for as long as possible. Choose a concrete object - avoiding abstract concepts such as 'home' or 'safety' and favouring everyday articles such as a hat or a broom - and shut your eyes, thinking only on that object until other thoughts begin to intrude. Stop the instant the distracting thoughts begin, wait for five minutes, and try again. This state of single-minded concentration will only be possible for one minute or so upon first beginning, but as with everything, the more it is practised, the easier it shall become.

When you can, at will, banish every thought from your mind except for the vision of your chosen object - and you can maintain this state for up to five minutes without distraction - proceed to the next exercise. This involves thinking of the space where your chosen object used to be, as if it had been removed from sight. This will be more difficult to concentrate upon for any significant length of time, and a return to the first stage of the exercise may be necessary if no progress is made after several attempts. It is at this point that you must begin associating this state of blankness with the word 'Legilimens,' either by uttering it aloud before entering it, or having another person do the same. In this way, the incantation will become an associative trigger, and, through repetition, will prompt you to enter an unreadable state just as your mind is penetrated. Test your ability to enter and maintain the blank state by having others distract you by means of sudden sound or physical contact.

Utter blankness is, to those using Legilimency, a sure sign that Occlumency is being used. In my next Draught, we shall proceed to those steps which will allow you to maintain the facade of a mind in its normal operations whilst concealing crucial information.

An Alternative to Chocolate as a Preventative and Restorative

Chocolate has long been considered the best remedy for the effects of proximity to Dementors, and indeed, before the current administration, the inexpensiveness and wide availability of chocolate made it the most practical choice. However, genuine chocolate derived from cacao beans now being a scarce commodity, and moreover, not being allowed to many who must necessarily need it most, we must turn to England's native plants. Yarrow - also known as old man's pepper, soldier's woundwort, thousandleaf, or thousandfoil - is a common summer plant to be found nearly everywhere, as it is hardy and drought-resistant. No part of this plant is poisonous. A note of caution: due to its effects on the many different systems of the body, women who are with child or nursing should not take this remedy. The rare person will have an allergic reaction to yarrow - test yourself before consuming it. See the illustration below for the purposes of identification.

Note its similarity in appearance to fool's parsley, or poison hemlock, and be wary of this when harvesting yarrow.

It has featured for many years in remedies both Muggle and magical for its uses as an astringent, a coagulant, and an antiseptic, but yarrow also possesses calming powers, particularly in conjunction with other healing tinctures. Either by itself, or, ideally, mixed with melted chocolate, a tea of dried yarrow leaves assists greatly in recovery from interactions with Dementors. Employing four to seven dried leaves to one pint of water, steep them in a covered pot of boiling water for ten to fifteen minutes so as to retain maximum potency. Without the benefit of added chocolate, it will have a bitter taste. This tea will be powerful, and should be drunk only in small amounts.

As always, use this information wisely.

However, it's true that one of the difficulties facing many who disapprove of the Protectorate is finding a way to speak together without attracting unwanted Ministerial attention. That's why codes are a vital tool. With a sufficiently clever code, members of secret societies may communicate openly under the very eye of Ministry officials - even those tasked with monitoring private messages.

There are many books on ciphers and cryptography which detail the creation of an effective code. The simplest involve using a book that all readers own or have access to read. A combination of numbers embedded in the text of your entry represent the page number and word on the page.

The Ministry are not so foolish, however, as to ignore a post consisting of nothing but numbers. We suggest a more subtle means of communication through creating a code in which discussing one topic equates to a place of meeting, another topic signifies the time, and so on, so that all who read your post will receive the signal to meet. Once assembled, you may discuss your discontent and make whatever plans you need.

For example, a leader may post something seemingly innocuous: a book review or an account of a child's recital. Hidden within the writing, however, may be phrases or words which are rare enough not to be confused, but plain enough not to attract attention. One location may stand in for another place - St Paul's for the Old Vic, for example - and the phrase 'one dozen' might signify noon or midnight. (As you might imagine, using a 24-hour clock among yourselves may be helpful to avoid confusion about that.)

The right code can mean the difference between a solitary dissenter shouting into the void and a united coalition of like-minded wizards and witches, working together to bring about change.

Use this information wisely.

He fell to his knees again, swearing all sorts of loyalty and repeating that he'd do *anything* to help the fabled Sirius Black.


Merlin. I hope I never get used to people treating me like a messiah.

I think I'd rather not do this one! Though it would be interesting, I guess, so long as it wasn't anything TOO important.







YPL Summer plans announcement

Dear YPL students and their parents,

I am delighted to announce that we have now completed our plans for the summer YPL projects.

Rising second years will again participate in the weeklong camping trip to study the flora, fauna, and history of Dartmoor and Cornwall.

Rising third years will again be visiting London in two groups, with a variety of visits planned to historical sites of interest, Ministry departments, and entertainment.

In both cases, letters are going home to parents this week with additional details, packing lists, and transportation notes. As always, costs are covered by the Ministry and the generosity of our Lord Protector.

Rising sixth or seventh year students wishing to provide supervision, support, and assistance on either trip should contact me directly for an application - again, there is a small stipend.

We are also delighted to announce a new activity for rising fourth years. Through a rigorous application process, students may petition to be included in a combined cadet force programme.

Training will last three weeks, at a location still being arranged, and will cover a variety of magical defence and duelling techniques, orienteering, tracking and mapping, field medwizardry, survival skills, support skills, and more. Students will focus on an area of particular interest in small groups, as well as participating in larger drill and skill training sessions.

We recognise that this is a substantial amount of the summer, but our expert teachers feel that any shorter time would be insufficient to offer a meaningful training experience. Students accepted this summer would also be expected to participate in the summer before their fifth year, and would have the option to continue in later years.

As the upper levels of the YPL program are designed for the best and brightest of our Lord's Protectorate, students who do not apply for

this opportunity will have limited chances to participate in YPL-only activities in future. (Students who apply but who do not meet the standards for this summer programme will be considered on a case by case basis for additional activities.)

Applications are available in my office and classroom. The application process has three parts.

1) Complete the written application and short essay, indicating the areas of study that you are most interested in. (Descriptions are provided on the application).

2) Write a letter via the Personal Message feature to someone in the field you aspire to enter professionally after leaving school. You should address the message to that person, and to Professor Sinistra, who will be evaluating you based on your choice, your etiquette, and your behavior. As many likely recipients are extremely busy with other duties, students should not be disappointed if they do not receive a direct response.

3) Students who succeed in this portion of the application will be invited to New London for a day of testing shortly following your return home from school. This portion will involve physical, magical, and intellectual tests. Parents are welcome to accompany their student, or designate a trusted friend or relative to do so (as there will be times when students will be waiting between tests without direct supervision), but will not be allowed in the actual testing rooms.

Lunch will be provided, along with a short presentation about the programme, and the selected roster will be read at tea, before students are dismissed for the day.

All necessary equipment will be provided by the YPL for use during the three weeks of the Combined Cadet Force programme: students will need to bring only their wand, journal, and other immediate personal necessities.

Questions can be directed to me via journal or owl, and students are of course welcome to stop by and discuss at any time I'm available.



You may be surprised to hear that I would like to be a Healer, because I usually try to avoid the Hospital Wing. But, I'm really quite interested in being a Healer like you.

As you know, I am a half-blood, and although I am in fostering now, until I was eleven I lived with my natural parents. When you are a blood-traitor family you can't simply go to St Mungo's for healing, and so if you are seriously ill or injured things can be very difficult. The 'healers' who will see you are sometimes not really healers at all. They charge quite a lot of money, and sometimes they're cruel, because they know their patients have no choice but to put up with it. (My parents, of course, chose their situation, but I was born into it and had to live that way until I was liberated from my parents' household by Our Lord's decree upon beginning at Hogwarts.)

My early experiences have given me quite a lot of empathy for people who may not have ready access to a healer, whether it is because of their situation of birth, their place of residence, or their lack of money. I would like to become a Healer who treats anyone at all who needs help and who is kind and tries not to hurt people (and who would never hurt anyone on purpose), like you. I would like to go to places in the Protectorate that might be far from St Mungo's, to treat people who are too ill or injured to make the journey. I am very good with children (in my foster home with Mr and Mrs Stretton I have done a great deal of babysitting for their younger children) and I think, if I were a Healer, I could put children at ease. I am also good at fixing things that are broken, and while I know Healing a person is not like fixing a broken pump or loom, the process of figuring out what exactly might be wrong seems to me like it might be similar.

The thing that most appeals to me about Healing is that it would be a job where I would be of service to others: where I could feel certain at the end of each day that I had made things a little bit better than they would have been without me. How many other career paths offer that?

I know it is difficult to get into Healer training programmes and as a

half-blood I may face particular challenges, so if you have any advice to me I would very much like to hear it (but if you don't have time I understand of course).

1. BOTH of the fire runes, both the one that

I mean, you'd have to be sure to erase that second one if you wanted to light a candle or something from your hearth fire but it would be worth having, a house fire is bad enough even when you can cast 'aguamenti' on it. And the one that keeps the fire from going completely out at night saves you a lot of trouble relighting it. Lighting a fire without a wand is a lot of work.

2. The peaceful sleep rune, although you know I tried it last night and I did not think it worked well. Definitely not as well as a dreamless sleep potion seems to work.The

3. The 'don't notice me' rune might be useful when hunting, I'm not sure. I tried it out to see if the pets in my dorm noticed some food I left out. They all noticed it after a while BUT they didn't notice it right away. Though maybe they just weren't hungry? My rat's nearly always hungry, though.

4. I was trying to decide if there was a way to mark a whole field of crops with that rune, because that might protect it from vermin trying to eat it. The anti-pest rune works on stored food but not so much on food while it's still growing.

5. The anti-rot rune would be good for stored food, even when you store it properly it sometimes spoils.

Anyway, I'm not sure any of these are exactly better than stuff that's available now, at least if you can get it. There's a charm that keeps a fire going exactly where you want it, there's dreamless sleep potion, there's an invisibility cloak (though actually animals can still smell you, can't they? so maybe the rune that keeps them from noticing you WOULD be better, if you need to go sneaking up on animals), there are a number of hexes you can use to keep birds and mice from eating your crops, and there are a dozen different ways to preserve food, some of them not even magical. (The Strettons use magic when they make their jams, but they basically do with magic what you'd do if you were making jam WITHOUT magic. It's just easier to heat the jars and then put the food inside if you can use charms.)

But they'd certainly have been indispensable in Ancient Britain.

- Several well-known figures in Our Lord's work have let us know that they would prefer to be contacted by owl rather than through the journals (for a variety of reasons: in some cases, they use the heavily journals for business related correspondence, in other cases, an assistant handles much of their correspondence for them.)

A list of those who would prefer to be contacted by owl is therefore posted by my office door, and has been provided to the common room of each House. This list also includes those who are open to either owl or journal messages.

Please note that I must see your letter as part of the application process. If you send a message by owl, please drop by my office during my usual open hours with two copies of your letter. You will leave one copy with me, and I will initial the other to indicate that I've seen it before it was sent.

The lists we are making available also include contacts at various Ministry departments and professional associations who are delighted to engage in conversation about their field of interest. If you are not sure who to write to, we suggest selecting someone from an area of interest to you. Madame Pince has some additional material on these departments and organizations in the library.

- While this summer's programme will have training on appropriate combat and defence skills (and in general, on building physical stamina, skill, and experience to support your magical training), there are a number of options for those who do not wish to focus on those areas of interest. As noted in the application forms, there are training options for herbology, medwizardry and healing, orienteering, and a variety of other practical skills.

- The deadline is noted on the application, but briefly, your application (and your letter to your chosen professional in a field of study that interests you) must be submitted before you leave school for the summer.
