Mr Thomas -

Your loyalty to your friend is wonderful, and I do understand why you feel you had to write. (I also

know you know there are people who would see it as rude or inappropriate, but that I am not one of them.) Now, clearly, I'm not going to discuss other students with you (though I've told Mr Finnigan he is welcome to come see me if he wishes). But if it would help, I am glad to share a little more of what went into the process. First, everything I said in the announcement was true: we had a wealth of wonderful applications, and it was an extraordinarily difficult process to make our final decisions. So much so that we spent all day Saturday, and much of Sunday working through the possible options.

Second, I was not making these decisions alone. Auror Wright and Mrs Provim both brought their own skills and insights to the process. We decided early on that we'd much prefer unanimous decisions, so we spent a long time, this week, talking about what mattered most to us in the selection for these positions. While I see all of you regularly, they've also had extensive opportunity to review your records and observe at various YPL events.

One thing that came up in that conversation, over and over again, was that selecting students to be a counsellor is a different thing than selecting them for the CCF, or even selecting them for a specific leadership role related to a particular project or activity. Particularly in as large and sometimes fractured a class as our current first years have been, we decided that we needed to give preference to certain qualities. These included demonstrated ability to respond well in a crisis, the ability to respond proportionately when provoked, a consideration for safety, and awareness of how someone works with others (both their friends, and those they do not get on well with.)

Third, we were also looking not just at individuals, but at a group. There are some basic questions of balance: we want roughly the same number of male and female students, for example, since the counsellors supervise housing. We wanted representation from all four houses. But we also wanted to build a group where some people might be gifted at encouraging cross-house interactions, while others might bring practical skills, or an ability to influence or direct the energies of younger students.

And so we made this set of choices, after a great deal of debate. We continue to look at ways to find ways for the students not selected for this opportunity to gain leadership and other skills, and to demonstrate their character and potential. (In fact, I'll be in New London discussing some of that this afternoon.)

I do look forward to your participation as a counsellor, and I'm very excited by the group we did select, even while I know the decision has been disappointing to several.

I'm so happy that my owl didn't find you too busy to consider being my mentor for the CCF application. I've thought a great deal about the questions you asked me in return, and I hope my answers will help give you a better idea of why I'd like so very much to be a naturalist.

My father always took me for long walks in the woods around our home from the time I was a very little girl, and he was the one who taught me to look for the signs of magical creatures. I learned how to sketch because I became fascinated with recording the details of what tracks and nests looked like, or the details of the way feathers lay on the back. (My handwriting was a bit sloppy because I was so young at that point, and so sketching was easier). I added paints later because I wanted so desperately to capture just the right colour of the iridescence on the wing of a Fireball Fly or the different jewel-like tones of glowing salamanders. I've spent years collecting notes and sketches in field books (my father showed me how). We kept a Life List of the magical animals and birds and so on that we saw, and it was always particularly exciting when we would find signs of a truly rare creature.

So Care of Magical Creatures is my favourite class, of course. But I'm particularly interested in what <u>you</u> do, working with particularly endangered magical species. My primary interest in Potions class is a little off-centre: I like trying to adapt potions or potion ingredients so that it's not necessary to use as much or as many ingredients taken from the really rarest animals. For example, did you know that when you're brewing Romney's Elixer for Speed, if you add three ounces of hag toe nail clippings, you only need three parts of unicorn hoof shavings to one part horse hoof shavings (instead of five parts)?

I only had to blow up four cauldrons to find that out, too!

I'm sending one of my field notebooks by return owl. I hope you will find it interesting. Thank you for your consideration.

Hullo,

Here it is:



"Dear Mr Rosier,

I hope you received my previous note of thanks for the tea basket. As I said, I shared the contents with several of the friends I have made during my time in the Protectorate. It made quite a jolly party.

I'm sure you will not be surprised to learn that I've been giving your kind offer quite a lot of consideration. I shan't deny that there are temptations here that I find compelling. But it's a monumental decision, to choose to leave forever the only home I've ever known.

I had a few questions, which I hope you shall not find forward, but which would go far toward easing my mind.

To begin, you mentioned that I'd be placed in fostering. May I ask how that would be accomplished? I'm sure it's an unusual situation, coming into a foster-family at such a late stage. As I'm only a year from my majority, I'm not keen to enter an arrangement that would present significant limitations on the independence I have enjoyed this year. Would it be possible instead to simply remain at Hogwarts over the school holidays, or to be assigned to one of the staff instead of moving in with another family for so short a period of time? Or does one's foster-family relationship continue beyond one's coming of age? And if so, what measure of influence does one's foster-family have the right to exact? Over what aspects of one's life? Apprenticeships? Property?

For example, I have been accustomed to manage my own finances. Would that be allowed to continue? And for that matter, those finances currently reside in accounts on the continent. Would I need to set up an account at Gringotts in New London or could I continue as I have been, transferring the funds there for withdrawal as-needed?

Second, the Young Protectors' League. In our initial meeting you said that I'd be given a chance to test in and participate. At what level? Obviously, I would not expect to be a counsellor but could I attempt to join the CCF, although the application deadline has passed? Would I remain involved in the activities with the rising-fourth year class or would it be more appropriate to join the rising-fifth?

Third, there's something that has been troubling me about the political direction you've said France is taking. As you know, my mother is not a witch, but a Squib. If the Magical Freedom Act passes, she may find her own independence impaired. She may even become the victim of harrassment, either pursuant to the bill in the French Wizengamot, or even as a reprisal by individuals who might take offence at my decision to remain in England. I hope you'll understand if I say that I am not ashamed of my mother or her capability to look after herself. However I know that bringing her in to the Protectorate would represent something of an embarrassment, one to which I am not eager to subject anyone. I wonder, therefore, if it would be possible to ensure her safe conduct to a new location of her choosing, where she will be less of a target to any who might wish her harm.

Fourth, perhaps most important, would be my studies within Hogwarts. Beauxbatons has a different academic pattern. I know that half-bloods must acquire a minimum number of O.W.L.s in order to remain in school for their N.E.W.T. levels and to be considered true citizens. I think you may appreciate my concern, then, that I should be entering the O.W.L. year without the previous years' preparation. Has there been any discussion with Headmistress McGonagall about overcoming that obstacle? I'd be willing to sit additional lessons or study under a tutor if that would be acceptable.

Finally, there is the matter of what would become of me as a denizen of the Protectorate. I should like to be able to express my gratitude, of course, but I wonder if you have any thoughts about what might be expected of me in that regard. Perhaps that's related to the question regarding fostering but I'm sure you'd know that better than I.

I certainly appreciate the openness with which I have been met and the opportunities I have been lucky enough to experience during my tenure as a visitor to Hogwarts. Despite the challenging circumstances of my birth, I have found myself welcomed here against all expectation. I hope that the questions I have outlined may be resolved before the end of term.

2. You've got a good point about foster-families, but I'd make it a little less like you're assuming any foster-parents would automatically be bad. Because they're not supposed to be, it's more to make sure that you'd have good influences, even though it doesn't always end up that way. Maybe instead of saying "exact," which makes it sound like they'd be punishing you or something, you could put it like you're asking about the advantages and disadvantages of gaining a foster-family, like first you can ask about what sort of help they could provide with getting a job, and then you could ask about things like property without coming off wrong.

3.The whole "expected of me" part is tricky. I don't know if you ought to ask right out like that. Maybe Sally-Anne has a better way to word it. I think you can plan on being paraded around a bit, and interviewed for the paper and things, but I'm not sure it's worth asking in the first place, really, unless there's something more specific you want to know.

Also. I have a solicitor, Ari Baddock, and he looks over all my contracts and things. I'm not sure if he'd be willing to take you on as a client, but it might be worth looking into to have a solicitor who's familiar with all of these things in the Protectorate who can read over anything that's been put in writing about you. And your mother. And if you mention that we're friends, and that you're also friends with Hydra, that might help. I'm not sure how much he'd ask for in terms of payment, but he'd tell you. And if he's too busy or something, he'd be able to direct you to one of his friends who could take you on. And if you were worried about your mother, and really wanted to be sure they'd do what they promised, it'd be better to do it that way than try to negotiate something on your own.

It'd also be a way to help keep your money safe. Mr Baddock is very good at that.

I'm not sure how long you can wait to send the letter, so I'm not sure you could send it to him first to look over, but I think he'd probably also want a copy of it, along with copies of letters from Mr Rosier. So I'd make a duplicate before sending it off. Just in case. Well, there's no question now why Norma Brownmiller's office was warded on Friday.

I read the story this morning, a four page spread, and it almost made me physically ill. The paper claims that MLE had known of her involvement

for months, and she's been the subject of both a departmental internal investigation and the MLE sting that finally cracked Dogstar. Minerva, we have had an <u>incredibly</u> narrow escape. When faced with arrest, the 'miscreants' did all they could to kill the brave enforcers, and rather than be captured, many took their own lives and the lives of their comrades. I note that there isn't any clear count of either the number arrested, or of the dead. Fourteen enforcers were injured in the raids. Most are expected to recover, but Our Lord's loyal people are asked to keep Copernicus Gibbon and Celaeno Painter in mind as they cling to life in St Mungo's.

There's an in-depth piece detailing the people involved in Norma's cell. The leader was an apothecary to one of the Muggle camps: Broxtowe, in Nottinghamshire. A few days ago, we all learned of the sweeping rout of an organisation that had set itself the task of bringing down the Protectorate regime. In what appears to have been an operation comprising months of work and dozens of staff, MLE managed to 'crush' most of the group that called itself the DogStar Company.

I've written before about my mixed reaction to that group and its supposed origins. It's not easy to find oneself becoming a rallying cry, especially when one's stated objectives and motives seem to have been adopted and ignored in equal measure by the group using one as its touchstone. The DogStar may have expressed sentiments many of you in the Protectorate feel and think and wonder and wish, but they spent too much time indulging their darker impulses, pursuing their goals by any means and giving too little thought to the collateral consequences of their actions. Nonetheless, the men and women of the DogStar clearly believed in their cause and in their final moments, proved their dedication to their credo. As tragic as it is to have lost so many lives, it would be more tragic still to decry them as having sacrificed in vain, or in service to a fool's notion.

Perhaps some of you reading this don't think of it as a loss. Perhaps you do think of it as ridding the country of a dangerous menace, a disruption that needed to be put down. Perhaps you were happy when you learned that the group behind the Quidditch World Cup bombing had met its inevitable sticky end. That's understandable, I suppose, especially if you lost someone there or through any of the other deeds attributed to them. But if you look more closely at who those people were, it's more sad than gratifying. Because they were, in the end, people: Mothers and husbands, sisters and sons. They were shopkeepers and teachers, office-workers and potioneers. They recognised that the Protectorate is an oppressive place and they took action to overthrow the despots who created the current state. Whether we agreed with their methods or not, they did sacrifice themselves in service to an idea of a better life for us all.

Yet that sacrifice may well lead one to wonder how the DogStar could have grown so large when its values were so radical and violent. Do the sentiments espoused by its members really pervade the entire

realm? If all their members - muggles, muggleborn, witches and wizards alike - did not support those darker impulses, then how could they have joined DogStar? How could they have worked so hard for an organisation that believed it could be acceptable to set off bombs that would kill hundreds of innocents, on the chance that they might take some of their enemies with them? There are probably as many answers as there are fallen.

Of course, I can't be sure but I think that in many cases, it may be because they thought there was no alternative. It could be that the strain of living under the yoke of oppression created by the Pretender and his Death Eaters drove many to choose DogStar's plan to take desperate action over sitting back and doing nothing. Or it could be that people began to think that DogStar's methods were *necessary*, that their violence answered the cruelty of the Protectorate in a way that non-violence could not do, that they were fighting fire with fire, as it were. That it was the only way to stop the brutality of the Ministry.

Unfortunately, as we've seen over and over, losing one's scruples in the face of an enemy does little but lower oneself to the same level. Using Dark methods to fight Dark wizards only turns one into the thing one is fighting. Instead of upholding justice, the DogStar became as brutal as the Ministry, as indiscriminate and as unjust.

I can't know why they did it, but I fear that many who found themselves in DogStar may not have realised before joining how ruthless a group it was. In that respect, they may have been similar to several who initially joined Voldemort without seeing the pit into which they were about to fall. I wonder how many who still serve him have now seen that the pit has no bottom, that there are no depths to which he will not sink, and who now deeply regret their choices but believe they are unable to escape.

I wonder how many in the DogStar felt a similar way, and how many justified their actions because they were in the name of the greater good.

The difference between good and evil is not just in motivation. It's in the lines one draws and will not cross. It's in the fundamental choice to not kill, no matter the provocation, to not bring harm to innocents even if doing so would stop a thousand murderers, to refuse to cast spells that violate the basic rights of the victim, such as subverting their free will. It is in looking long and hard at what we are and are not willing to do to improve the lives of those we wish to help. It is in
continuing to seek out others with the same moral code and freely advocating to take only those actions which uphold that code. It is in relying on one another, constantly and continually, to help each other resist the temptation to resort to magic that will cause irreparable harm.

If there is a Grim Truth from the events of the last several months, it is that the surviving members of the DogStar - and anyone else who is mourning their colleagues - still have a choice. The remnants of that organisation can still remember and honour the lost by reforming to fulfill a better purpose. I urge them to re-examine their goals and the path to achieving them. I hope that they can find alternatives to wasting the human potential their former comradeship had amassed.
