

fact you're not here. Are you certain that's the impression of diligence you really want to put forward, especially to our impressionable young people?


Now, you and your young man did look quite striking last night. (I do hope Yvaine Warrington wasn't too unpleasant, by the by.) It's most



So yesterday we had this class on muggle crowd control.

And don't misunderstand me, it was really interesting. They showed us the Herding Charm, and talked about how it was

originally developed by wizarding farmers to herd animals but it can be used on groups of muggles as well, and it's a little like Imperius on a large group but much easier to resist.

They used the charm to get all the muggles to come in, and then pick up some metal objects, which weren't weapons of course but they noted that most muggle weapons were made of metal (and muggles still sometimes think metal tool = potential weapon).

And then they showed us the Vulcanis charm, which heats metal very quickly, and all the muggles cried out and dropped the things they were holding.

And one was really loud about it, actually, I think she didn't get it out of her hand fast enough and she let out a real shriek and then the instructor said, this leads me to the next useful charm, and he cast a curse jinx charm spell that took her voice away. She was still making faces like she was screaming but nothing came out. And then he showed us there was a larger version of the same charm.

And then he showed us the Boundary Jinx, which (like the Herding Charm) was originally used to work with animals but does work well with muggles, too, because they don't like pain any more than animals do. And then he wanted them to move really close together so he shrank the boundary, but one muggle woman (the one who'd been burned, I think) dropped to the floor and just wouldn't move. I thought he was going to It was like she'd I guess she just wasn't in the mood to be cooperative, and he was frustrated that she wasn't cooperating so he used Imperius and that worked well and they finished and then we went off to do something else and here's the thing, Professor Sinistra, I am not very good at this sort of thing. I have to just admit this, I'm SOFT, and I know that's not a good thing, it's not what Our Lord wants, but when I look around me I see some adults I respect immensely who are also soft and some of them are even teachers of matrons so I think I can probably be useful in His Service the way I okay I am running out of time so I'll write quickly.

I took Dark Arts for one of my electives. That was a mistake. I really hate it. The class, I mean. Since Healer Stint kindly indicated a desire to read what I'm learning at the seminars I'll be attending in these summer weeks, I'll steal a moment on this Sunday morning to tell you about my studies here on a research platform in the middle of Moray Firth.

This is a beautiful and fascinating outpost in our northern waters. Some of the teams here are studying weather; others, water; others still are studying the marine life in this bay; but I'm here with a group of Healers to learn what can be taught about treating water-related injuries. I only wish I'd had this course before our tournament last year when we asked our champions to brave the bitter waters and hostile creatures of our Hogwarts lake.

In the first week, we treated victims of savage creature attacks, saving a surprising number and easing the trauma of passing in the remaining cases. I refreshed skills that are easily transferable to treating other sorts of trauma than merely aquatic accidents. We've also, of course, been studying the effects of hypothermia and exposure to extreme conditions, collecting data that our instructors, Healer Soddenham and Master Healer Sturgeon, will use in a paper they are writing on the subject.


I'd scarcely dare question Irma's observational skills - she's her usual sharp self here (and spotted two things I'd not consciously noticed.)

We've had quite a morning. We went out as soon as the weather died down and it was light enough to see, and I'm taking a moment to update everyone before heading back to work.



The storm was indeed a bad one -- we haven't had one on quite that magnitude for ten years at least. We're all safe and sound, but we lost four goats and a dozen chickens. One of the greenhouses was smashed to pieces by a falling tree. There's glass everywhere and we're working as best as we can to salvage as many of the plants as possible, but it will be difficult. The other two greenhouses are in much better shape -- they were sheltered from the worst of the winds, and we only lost a few panes of glass in each along with some minor water damage, but our fluxweed supply has been halved. The roof held, but is in sore need of repair, and several windows will also need to be replaced. Our new dormitory addition wasn't fully walled in yet, so that had quite a bit of damage as well. Victor is currently assessing the boats, and I've no idea if they are still seaworthy until he comes back with his report.

Everyone with a wand is currently shin-deep in mud, trying to accio the root vegetables out of the ground so we can store them properly before they rot. There's very little we can save of the veg that was above ground. It's late in the summer to re-plant those particular crops, but we'll see what we can do once things dry out a bit. We had a good month in July, so we've got quite a bit canned and preserved already, but August's crops of tomatoes, courgettes, peas, cabbage, and corn will be sorely missed. Our carrots, onions and potatoes are such staples of winter that I'm hoping we'll be able to save as many as we can, but we won't really know until October whether we'll have enough to float us through. I have a feeling we'll be very dependent on the solstice shipment this year.

I've got to get back to it now. I'll be sure to keep you all appraised.

We're thinking perhaps a wedding over Easter holidays, which simplifies some things, but does mean we'd want to make a more lasting shift in rooms midyear. And while I hope you've no undue concern about our behaviour around students, I'd rather talk about that now than have it be a discomfort later.

Beyond that, though, I presume the YPL oversight committee has already been in touch? They've required I not discuss their choices before the public announcement, but at this point, I do not want to be responsible for laying one more surprise at your feet, so if they haven't, I'd rather explain.

I am still tied to Leicester for much of this week, and Raz has commitments for some of the next, but I can get free for an hour or two somewhere here if needed.

I wrote a letter to Sirius Black and he wrote back. I'm going to transcribe his letter here partly because it's advice to all of us, really, but mostly because I want to be able to come back and read it later but I want to burn the actual letter. I think sometimes at CCF they search our stuff when we're not here.

Here's what he wrote:

Miss P,

Like many of your friends, you make a central mistake in your line of questioning: You accept the premise that there is a single, simple answer to what you ask. That there is a definite wrong and a definite right. I'm afraid we don't live in a world that easily divided.

I'm concerned that you think you can't discuss these questions, difficult as they are, with your own agemates. If your friends are any kind of friends at all, you ought to be able to wrestle with the issues, even if you disagree, and together gain insights to yourselves and each other. I think you'll find that you are all struggling with the same conundrums - and that many times, the answers lie not so much in what you *do* as in what you learn about each other.

However, I think it's unfair to ask you to open that discussion with your friends without showing you that adults sometimes have to talk things through, as well. Accordingly, I showed your letter to two close colleagues of mine, one a little older than yourself and one closer to my own age, and we decided to share all our answers with you.

You ask about non-violence. Unfortunately, while we all wish we could achieve our goals without any bloodshed, we're all a bit cynical that it's possible. The question is one of degree. People like the DogStar don't care who they hurt, or how, or why, in the path of reaching their goals. That sort of indiscriminate violence is despicable. In the Muggle world, there have been successful campaigns of non-violence, where people put themselves in the path of violent men and eventually earned the world's support. But those campaigns were in places with due process, where regular citizens could participate in democratic change, where they cared when innocent people got hurt. That kind of protest can't survive in a place run by fascists. So it's hard to imagine a way to stop *everything* without resorting to some directed violence. But what matters is the why and the how much. If you have a choice between using a brutish method and a persuasive one, nearly always, the persuasive one is a better course. If you don't have that choice, however, then there's little to be done.

As for killing, we all agree that it's to be avoided, but again, there are times when it's entirely justified. Such as in self-defence, when your opponent has no intention of letting you walk away. But in terms of the Unforgivables, they are Unforgivable for very good reasons, all three of them. Think about the fact that the Killing Curse is just that: a Curse with only one purpose and only one outcome. Casting it requires conviction and a certain amount of desire to do harm. I'm not saying (and neither are my friends) that there are *no* circumstances in which it would be understandable, but generally speaking, there are almost always alternatives to the AK, alternatives which would subdue one's foe but not necessarily end them forever. As my younger friend said, 'Once it's done, there's no taking it back.'

Now, you ask about more gradated instances and you know what? We can't answer that for you. That's an intensely personal judgement and a lot depends on the circumstances. We are not the ones who will be sent to the camps if expelled from Hogwarts or who has to live your life. You're a good and decent person in a situation where it's sometimes possible to behave decently, and sometimes incredibly risky. You have close friends who are living these risks with you. Talk to them, and make your own choices about what you can live with, and what will lose you your self-respect. Also, if you can, imagine what your 'victim' might want if you were in her circumstances. For example, if your choice were between kicking someone else's servant or being sent to the camps, that servant might wish for you to spare yourself, but try not to kick too hard. If the choice were between kicking her or being soundly mocked by another classmate, then I think you're confident enough to survive a few schoolvard taunts. To say nothing of the respect you might lose among your true friends for taking the easy way out, at someone else's expense.

The Protectorate is trying, deliberately and methodically, to create these no-win situations precisely to test your resolve and find the cracks through which they can chip at your sense of right and wrong. The best advice I can give - that I can continue to give all of you - is to understand and create your options. Try to see through the lies and beyond the black-and-white, into the grey spaces. The more you reject their premise, the better equipped you will be to think outside of their 'choices' and find ways to subvert their careful, calculated plans.

Protectorate, I'm afraid we must confront them whether we wish to or not.

Of course you can't tell him about the Order, but I suppose you can tell him about some of the dilemmas you face at work, and how you try to weigh the harm you must do against the good you hope to accomplish. He needs to carefully weigh the benefits that the programme can give him. Are the benefits truly worth it? Is he learning valuable skills? Will those skills put him in a position to be able to help people later on? Those *pros*, whatever they are, must be weighed against the *cons*, which includes the harm he may be forced to do. And yes, harming others, especially using the Unforgiveables, will mean harming himself.

We taught our trainees that the first step was threat assessment, and there are many choices available to them before they should think to use deadly force. Threats escalate depending on whether the person doing the threatening is a friend, a neutral or an enemy. And who is he protecting? Himself, a friend, or a bystander? Reactions can range from warning to attempting to escape, to causing injury without causing permanent harm, to permanent injury, to death.

So that's how I'd suggest you start, with a talk about the benefits of the programme. To my mind, they'd have to be downright spectacular to justify mucking about with the Unforgiveables. Best to avoid those if all possible. And you had best warn him about the dangers of dealing with Dolores Umbridge if he stays in. You know very well how poisonous she is, no matter how sweet she pretends to be.

(As well -- I would like to commend you on your tact and diplomacy when discussing the curriculum your own study of the Arts involved. Having finally had the chance to examine what was being taught -well. I apologize for intimating the blame for your unfamiliarity with certain seminal works may have rested on your own shoulders; further, deponent sayeth not.) My elf Berry will be calling upon you at some point this afternoon to deliver a parcel of books too awkward for owl post. Should you find them at all useful, do consider them a gift; I am drowning in the things and you will no doubt obtain more use from them than I will. (Should you find them dreadfully dull, pass them along to someone who will not -- you will know better than I which of your contemporaries would appreciate them the way books deserve.)

Tucked into the front of the *Cavernae Medullitae* is a suggested reading order (with a few key passages noted), and I've also copied out the booklist I will be using for NEWT-level classes for your future reference. Do not purchase them now: I've spent the last two days in pointed battle with Flourish & Blotts over their ability to provide copies in sufficient number for my students, and, I am sad to say, students will likely be sharing many of their books this year, during first term at least. But once F&B are able to correct their incompetence, I suspect you will find Clements-Chichester's *Grimories of the Worthy Families* to be a useful reference for the circles around which you find yourself moving.

The slender volume atop the stack is a fair copy of my own translation of Aleksey Vladimirovich Korovin's *Mastery over Self* -that's the book I mentioned as being the most helpful guide I've ever found to mapping one's inner landscape. You will gain the most utility from it by following its exercises exactly, spending as little or as much time on each meditation as you feel necessary to fully appreciate its nuances. Ten minutes a day should suffice, stretching to twenty once you've completed the first sequence. Do not expect immediate results -- for instance, I am not likely to make it much past the fifth sequence with my classes this year -- but also do not hesitate to reach out to me if you feel you are "stuck" too long on any one exercise: the whole of the third sequence, for instance, is notoriously difficult for a solo practitioner to summit and my translator's notes alone may not suffice.

Mind you, unlike the rest of my soon-to-be flock, I certainly have no authority to assign <u>you</u> homework! And I imagine my old friend keeps you quite busy. (Having seen the way your eyes kept being drawn to my shelves throughout our conversation, though, I suspect wild centaurs couldn't drag you away.) Should you have time and inclination to discuss your study, though, I would be pleased to assign some of what little time I shall have free in the coming year or so to hearing your thoughts. Should you happen to be at home when the delivery arrives, meanwhile, the elf has been instructed to lend you the afternoon if you should have any suitable tasks. I hardly mean to be rude or to make you self-conscious, but at several points during our visit I believe I sensed a hint of the exhaustion that inevitably arises from too many responsibilities hanging unaddressed over one's head. 





Those for whom my name is unfamiliar: I am Antonin Dolohov, Our Lord's true and loyal servant and former ambassador-at-large from the Protectorate to wizarding governments of the world.

Over the years, Our Lord has often inspired me with His vision for the future of our nation, particularly regarding the study of the noble and ancient magics known to many by the name of "the Dark Arts". For many years before Our Lord came to power, misguided notions and incomplete information about the Noble Arts have caused people to fear and shun their use. True strength, however, lies in confronting outdated superstition and in understanding, embracing, and working to improve one's own abilities and affinities, which cannot be done when an entire subject of study still lingers under the shameful taint of decades -- centuries -- of mistrust. Our Lord has long wished for the study of the Noble Arts to regain its proper lustre, and I am pleased to serve as the instrument of His will, in this as in all else.

To that end, I write to announce a revision to the Hogwarts curriculum. My classroom door will be open to -- and my class required for -- all students who pass through Hogwarts' gates, beginning with this school year with some few exceptions. There will, no doubt, be a brief (and regrettable) period of disruption as we transition to the new requirements; however, I will do my utmost to minimise the disturbance and enable Our Lord's vision for a safe, strong, well-educated generation of youth marching forth into our collective future.

Parents, I eagerly await the chance to meet each of your children and assist them, on both their academic journey and the path of personal discovery each student of the Arts will find himself upon. Please allow me to reassure the trepidation that inevitably arises from unexpected change: the welfare of your children is my primary concern, and I have years of experience in mentoring students of the Arts to develop self-control over mind and body both. When properly supervised, study of the Noble Arts is rewarding, illuminating, and perfectly safe. If you have any questions at all about the curriculum I have designed and Our Lord and the Hogwarts Board of Governors have approved, I am reachable by owl and by journal. A student is best served by teacher and parent working together; I look forward to allowing that partnership to flourish.

Anyone seeking to expand their familiarity with the Noble Arts and what their effective study entails may wish to obtain a copy of Khātūn's *Omnium mortalum* (once, alas, the bookstore is able to locate sufficient quantities, which may be some time) or Salieri Brambell's *A Tool In Hand*, both of which are excellent introductions to the subject and its many facets.

To some practicalities:

- For those sixth and seventh year students who have had no previous instruction in the Noble Arts: we have decided the disruption to your studies and to the school as a whole would be too severe to require the class now without allowing for a grounding in basic principles. However, the list of texts has been sent to you as optional reading, and you are encouraged to join in the extracurricular enrichment and the evening and weekend gatherings I will be hosting, should you wish to make up for lost time. Please do make free of my open hours, whether registered for my classes or not. I am here to educate and serve.
- Sixth and seventh year students: I must apologize in advance for the difficulty I anticipate the bookstore will have in filling all orders immediately. They have not yet been able to acquire sufficient copies of Wierus's *Musaeum mallificarum cardinalium*, or an acceptable translation of ibn Waḥšīya's *Commentaries Upon 'Intra profundis*'. (To accomodate the delay, we will begin our term with the Clements-Chichester and Calidus.) If your head of family will allow you to bring personal or familial copies of any of the required texts, please do so, and save the bookstore copies for those who are not as fortunate. If you have spare, non-heirloom copies whose potential loss would not be a tragedy, please consider lending them to your classmates.
- For those entering their third year, your timetables have been revised to reflect that my class is now a core requirement, not an elective, for third year and above. Those of you who feel, or

whose guardians feel, this overburdens your schedule will be permitted to choose one elective from which to withdraw. As with the NEWT texts, the bookstore has been unable to acquire Khātūn's *Omnium mortalium*. (To accomodate the delay, we will begin with Brandt et al.'s *Introduction to....*) As above, if you have your own copies of any of the texts, please bring them with you, and please consider lending any spare copies to your classmates.

- Fourth and fifth year students: though my own Hogwarts years are (well) behind me, I am wholly sympathetic to the shock of such last-minute upheaval to your plans for the year, particularly for those of you preparing for OWLs. Please do not worry: my curriculum is designed to be accessible to all, including those who have had no previous formal study. I will be entirely reasonable in my requirements of you. My love for my chosen field runs deeply, and I shall do my best to instill that love in you as well. I hope to reassure you at our first meeting that my class will be nowhere near as dreadful as you may be fearing.
- To all who are new to the subject: in recognition of the sad truth the Noble Arts do not answer readily to the hands of all wizards, my class will -- though now required for all -- be divided into options for theoretical study and practical application. Each student will elect the course of study best suited to his interests, affinities, and future plans. No one will be penalized for an unfortunate difficulty with the wandwork who is willing to apply himself to the theoretical understanding.

Good afternoon - I admit that I'm struggling with the etiquette here, so I hope you don't mind my leaping directly into professional-colleague mode. First, welcome to the Hogwarts staff. I had the opportunity

to hear quite a lot about you from the Malfoys and Lestranges this past weekend (all clearly delighted at your return, and your new teaching role.) I do want to ask - having heard half a dozen names used for you the past few days - what do you prefer as a general rule? Generally, the staff are on a first name basis, with a little variation. I'm Aurora mostly, except for Raz, who calls me Rory unless we're being formal. (You may already know, but Raz and I are recently engaged to be married, rather to the startlement of many of his friends and relations, and our mutual pleasure.)

But I should move on to the actual reasons I'm writing. First, I've been at Hogwarts long enough (this is my eighth year) to both remember all the things no one tells you when you begin teaching, and to know many of the answers. 




