I've been thinking about Ridley's question -- and I'm sure it needs a great deal more thought from all of us before coming to a final decision.

Sally-Anne has a good point in that we should see what she'd be willing to offer us in exchange, just to see what we'd have on the table to negotiate with.

I don't trust that she'd follow any guidelines we would ask her to abide by. We have to anticipate that she would use this for her own purposes, which would potentially be useful to us as well if she continues to target MLE and the Council, but we must anticipate that she would do so without consideration for loss of life when it comes to others caught in the cross-fire.

I agree with Poppy in that its use is fairly limited -- all one would have to do would be to walk out of the field in order to restore use of magic -- but as established in Saltash, wizards are vulnerable within the field, and if there is a large enough concentration of motivated and trained people to stop them, it could prove a challenge.

One thing to consider is that unlike her tactics at Saltash, this field makes Muggles much more capable of defending themselves, so they're less likely to be used by her as mere fodder and more likely to be seen as potentially valuable assets, which is a distinct improvement from her previous mindset.

That is one area where we have a potential advantage -- we have far greater connections within the non-magical community, and will eventually have the capacity to potentially be able to wake up Sleepers who would have military training and capabilities -- something I doubt she has spent much energy or thought on, as Muggles have not been her primary focus. Perhaps she would be willing to coordinate with us more directly in order to help muster people with hand-to-hand training who would be able to be of great use in such a situation, which gives us a little more control over how and when she uses it.

I have the impression that her lack of consideration for safety and loss of life also makes her more likely to attempt to cast this spell with a much greater frequency than I ever would. To a certain extent, this places the burden of cost on her people instead of ours -- something worth considering if we are to think through the possible value and use of such a spell.

Does anyone have any additional thoughts? I'm sure several of you have been chewing it over all night, as I have, and I'd appreciate your insights.

On a side-note, Frank and I have been talking about what his new responsibilities might be, and what we can do to help him be more mobile and communicate more directly with all of you. One of the ideas we tossed around would be to have Colin Creevey assigned to act as Frank's secretary and to assist with his and Fu Lee's Apparation so they could both be a bit more independent. We haven't approached Colin yet with the idea, but I'm sure he'd be eager to help however he could. He's been considering going to Sherwood with Terry and the rest, but this could be a way he could be quite useful to all of us. It would entail swearing him into the Order, something I'm very willing to do, but I wanted to run this past everyone first.

Well, first off, it was obvious to more than Miss Perks that the only appropriate way to open negotiation with Ridley, if we were going to do, was to ask what she's prepared to offer in exchange, and what she has in

mind to do if we strike a bargain. I'd be interested in doing that even if we have no intention of telling her about the spell, for a number of reasons:

- -It tells us what she thinks she has that's valuable or that she thinks we would find of value;
- -It tells us how desperate she is (or isn't) to get her hands on a new spell;
- -It tells us how valuable she thinks the effect would be to her group if she gets her hands on it;
- -It tells us what *she* thinks she might be able to do with it.

As for what she could or couldn't do, we clearly need to hold our cards close to the vest to find out what she thinks it is. (There were already clues in her message, such as whether it was a variant of the Sleeper spell itself. I think she might be hinting that she thinks it's a combination of Sleeper spell and Fidelius.) The less we can tell her early on, the more she'll tell us. That will help us determine if she's

planning something we couldn't condone - though as you say, Allie, there's no guarantee she'd keep any promise she made, even if we asked her to make one. All I'm saying is that if she's trying to guess its uses, she's more likely to say things that will betray her plans.

With that in mind, it also makes sense not to let on that anything has happened to Frank, not at first. I can simply tell her he's delegated the task to me, if she even asks. She might assume he's dead, which would not necessarily be a disadvantage in negotiating with her. Element of surprise, and all that.

Now. As for our own applications, I think we all agree that the cost is too high to risk casting it again, unless we're assured that doing so would end this conflict completely. Even then, I'm not sure who among us who is capable of casting the spell would be willing - I mean, sorry, not that we wouldn't be willing in order to end the war and free the camps, put an end to Voldemort. Merlin, I'd think rendering Voldemort helpless would be a fair trade. But. If we can somehow convince one of Ridley's people to do it, well, I'm not going to argue. The real trick, far as I'm concerned, would be making sure that the wizard or witch who's undertaking that kamikaze mission is doing so completely voluntarily, without any coercion. I'm not sure we'd have any way to know that, unless we did try to work with Ridley to affect some scenario in which the spell's deployed in conjunction with a coordinated strike against Voldemort, before he could leave the zone and regain his powers.

If we're not going to come up with that sort of scenario, and unless someone can think of an equally compelling reason for one of us to undertake the spell I think the best possible 'use' for it is to try to draw Ridley out in conversation and then tell her the, er, 'hidden cost' of what she's trying to buy.

The way I think it would work as a weapon is if one deployed it around, say, Marlborough House, on a night when we knew Voldemort and all his friends would be visiting; then before they could leave, storm in with Muggle weapons at the ready and capture all their wands. We'd have to have a plan beyond that, but you see my meaning. Otherwise they'd leave the house and we'd be no better off than we were - in fact, worse, in a number of ways.

Which is precisely why I don't think it makes much sense to weaponise the spell - and why it would be next to impossible to devise a plan that DogStar would agree to enact.



And Dad taught him how to play chess, same as me.





Is this something you genuinely wish to pursue? Duty can help one push through rough spots, but if you would be utterly miserable at this job, that would make a difficult situation worse.

This is an initial step down that particular path, of course, not a final one, and there would certainly be opportunities to better assess your suitability and desire to continue as you learn more about the requirements. I think if you're interested enough in this potential opportunity to learn more, an internship would be a reasonable way

to do that.

I'd ask that as you consider this possibility, you do some soulsearching about what your potential weaknesses could be, and where you would draw the line in terms of what you might have to be prepared to do. There's no way to know everything right away, of course, but you can certainly give serious thought to whether this would be something you could honestly see yourself doing on a daily basis, and what sort of obstacles you might encounter along the way.

Sirius, just so you know, Alice gave me permission to tell Rachel Lamont some of what we know about Mysteries. So I met with Rachel tonight, at her flat.

She said that it's been quite clear since Saltash that Cadmus' magic is demonstrably more powerful. There are others who are interested in getting their hands on a similar source of power, Lucius Malfoy being one.

I told her this is why we were wanting to get a window into Mysteries, because they were the ones responsible for the Mulcibers' new fighting ability. I didn't speak of a machine; I simply said it was a process under development, a secret that's been closely held up until now. It had an ugly enough price that we thought we had common cause with Dogstar in wishing to shut this process down. The danger is that now with Cadmus Mulciber's demonstration yesterday, buyer demand is going to go up. In turn, that means it's more likely for the secret to get out and be impossible to contain.

Miss Parkinson: the results of your benchwork have proven acceptable in practise. If you are able to free yourself from the pressures of your social calendar over holiday, you would be welcomed in the laboratory, but do not arouse suspicion if your absence would be noted. Over holidays, consider carefully whether your schedule will continue to accomodate our work; if you wish to continue, knowing as you do now the exceptional pressures upon your time it will entail and the exacting nature of my standards and requirements, I am willing to further your tutelage upon return to Hogwarts in January.

The exact nature of that tutelage is up to you: I am content both to teach you just as much as you would need to know to brew only the potions that we require, or to go beyond instruction in mere brewing mechanics and delve more deeply into the underlying theory. The latter is a far more fraught proposition. You would never be allowed to claim the experience I am offering to any representative of the Guild. Should you be interested in a further career in potioneering, you would need to repeat that work under more recognised aegis — likely stultifying, and possibly dangerous should anyone realise you have been studying under a Master of whom they do not approve. I would urge you through the bulk of the NEWT curriculum as quickly as possible, rendering your classes with Slughorn no more than review and requiring you to conceal your experience from him as much as possible. There are undoubtedly other disadvantages I cannot immediately call to mind.

Should you be interested in the proposition despite these disadvantages, you ought first ask Miss Granger about the precision, commitment, and attention to detail I require from an apprentice, and carefully consider whether you are willing to make the sacrifices that would be necessary to enter into such an arrangement. I am an exacting man who does not suffer fools gladly, has little patience with anyone who enters the laboratory with anything less than full commitment, and does not accept mediocrity no matter what the

You want it to be worn constantly, you want it to be difficult to take off, the circular nature of a ring or a bracelet significantly enhances the magic because it 'encloses,' and -- oh, the other reason it wouldn't be the bracelet he used to send an alarm is that the materials would be different. For loyalty magic you want gold or iron and you want a pure metal whereas for communications magic there are loads of things that will work but you usually want a MIX of materials and not pure gold or pure iron.

The talisman, hm, I mean you CAN make a talisman with that sort of magic on it but I also don't think you'd use a bull. And especially if the person were able to fight AT ALL a talisman would just be stupid, because they could pull it off. Rings, you can make them impossible to take off. (You can make them really hard to take off even WITHOUT magic.)

Anyway my point is just that it's probably not an object. Unless -- well it could be invisible or with a VERY strong notice-me-not charm but then you wouldn't be able to tell without touching. 



Fu and me have been making the rounds to Bedford and Aldrich, setting up some workshops for crank radios, Fu's armour, and some of the less advanced weaponry we've been working up. Aldrich's better suited for radios, and Bedford's in a good place for helping us make the armour as they've got a supply of leather and they can get a forge up and running quicker. Fu's decided to keep making the more dangerous things like his nonlethals on his own at Moddey because of safety protocols. It's easier to make a bolt for a crossbow than a timed explosive, because if you get the bolt wrong, it doesn't blow up in your face.

We've also scheduled trainings twice a month at Alrich and Bedford to brush up on Defence. Sherwood's designated some folks to come and help, too. We've been sorting through different fighting strategies depending on whether the person who's fighting has a wand, doesn't have one yet but has wandless magic, doesn't have any magic at all, and how it all changes up in a null field. Not to mention differences in fighting in a city versus an open area. We'll have our work cut out for us. Most of the magical people in Aldrich have wands now, and we're getting there with Bedford, and each site has some people who went through at least a few years of schooling who can teach the basics, but they've got a lot of work to do.

Making it into Saltash is difficult. Kingsley managed to get me over there for the day, seemed like they were getting on pretty well. Can't risk Colin taking me just yet -- he doesn't have the secret, which would take time to sort out, and there's always a risk someone would be waiting to take potshots at us because we can't Apparate right in. They're still working on their underground access, though, and once they've got that done, it'll be easier to get there, and their people will be better able to take things outside of the field for quick fixes. It was good to go there, see it for myself. Once they sort out their access tunnel, I think we'll make it out there more often so we can set up defence training there too. They gave us some wands they'd confiscated from the wizards who were stuck in the field, and we got them to Melli, who'll strip them down and use their cores.

Strangeweale/Mysteries Plans

Everyone agreed we should move forward on this as quickly as possible -- which is to say, TODAY.

The Order will infiltrate Mysteries, polyjuiced as Strangweale and a potential victim. (I think Alice has decided on Kingsley and Severus.) Please note that Mysteries takes a variety of precautions against polyjuice, but our interrogation of Strangeweale revealed at least the precautions he was aware of. Severus, Sirius, and Rachel Brodie were fairly certain he was not holding information back.

Strangeweale also revealed he'd given a report to Cadmus Mulciber; Dogstar will handle that retrieval. He also gave us the names of four people who acted as research assistants or otherwise had detailed information about his process. Dogstar will also handle the elimination of those individuals.

The Order will raid Strangeweale's breeding farm and rescue the people there and with the assistance of Timothy (Strangeweale's muggleborn servant, now free from compulsion magics) will clear out and destroy his house. We'll also work on persuading the goblins not to let anyone into his vault.

Ridley requested polyjuice for her people, to get them into Mulciber's house undetected and to get close to their other targets. Alice agreed.

The Neo-Fidelius

Ridley requested that these negotiations be closed to everyone but her and the leader of the Order. She started out the meeting believing that this was Sirius, and we all did our best to play along, but at this point she made it clear we'd given Alice away. So the rest of us cleared out and left Alice to talk with her. Bill apparated away to fetch some polyjuice and the rest of us sat around awkwardly for a while. So this next bit is based on what Alice told me happened, I wasn't there

to take notes.

Alice told Ridley about the costs and precise effect of the neofidelius and said that if Dogstar wants to run a joint operation, they can provide a target and a volunteer and the Order will help that person cast it, and then obliviate them. (If they survive. No guarantees.)

Ridley revealed that they have a way to get portkeys. In exchange for the actual casting instructions for the neo-fidelius, she offered a dozen unregistered portkeys to whatever destinations (within the Protectorate) we'd like. We can think this over. In the meantime, she'll ponder possible targets and people who might be willing to cast the spell.

Bill, it sounds as though Ridley cleared the room in part because she doesn't want Rachel knowing that they have someone in the portkey office. I would assume this is because she thinks Rachel's in a high-risk position, and too likely to get caught.

Rachel's Role

She seems to have a great deal of support – over half of the women have decided to go there together, all either with babes in arms or currently pregnant. Emily Ashton has requested we bring her Mary to her from Moddey once they've had a chance to get settled, and I'm very glad she'll be reunited with her mum. Ten of the women who are going to Bedford are pregnant, and would need to be escorted over land. Hiring carts is a possibility, although it would take at least two days of travel to get there from London.

Two of the women -- Jeanne Harris and Laurel Sinclair -- want to be with their sisters at Sherwood, so would need separate over land transport.

Pilar Mishraput and Clara Foster, two of the younger girls (they think they're around fifteen, but aren't sure – I expect they were just old enough to avoid the machine themselves) are interested in going to Moddey, and we're certainly willing to take them. James Armstrong was also surrendered to us as well, to be raised by us at Moddey. We can Apparate with them, so that won't prove too much difficulty at all.

A few of the women made the decision to go to Saltash – I can see how being in a place without magic might appeal to them. There's also a few who are going to Aldrich to see what they can do there. We'll be Apparating them to their desired locations as well.

The men have all decided to go to Sherwood, and will be making their

way there today. One, Jason Crenshaw, is actually a half-blooded wizard. He got sent to the camps for hiding his neighbour, who ended up at Sherwood, so he'll have a friendly face to look forward to. And Scott Brownmiller came back from Sherwood this morning in a tizzy – apparently, Delancy Ambleston, one of the other men, is actually related to Cecelia and Sally-Anne – his mother is Cecelia's sister. We'd asked for everyone to make lists of their immediate family members in the off-chance that there might be a relative who'd be willing to take them in, and it's a good thing we did. 

Right, then, realised I hadn't updated everyone on where we stand with the goblins.

Mum had a cursed dagger that she inherited a few years ago, and I went to present it to the



<u>**Aalt charlie**</u>

goblins at Gringott's to ask them to find the owner and give it back. (For those of you who don't remember, goblin sense of ownership's different than ours. To them, the person who made the thing owns it, and 'buying' it from them doesn't transfer the ownership, it's only renting it for the life of the buyer. So, by inheriting the dagger, we were actually stealing it from the goblins, in their view.)

Griphook, the goblin we've been talking to most of the time -- he's not one of the Clan Elders, that much I know, but I don't know exactly what his status is, except that the Elders sent us to him when we tried to talk to them -- was very surprised when I brought it, but surprised in the good sort of way. We had a very nice talk about many things, including goblin grievances with wizardkind, the main ones being the Code of Wand Use and the disagreement about how 'ownership' works.

I told him I couldn't speak for everyone, but as far as I was concerned, "if I were ever in charge" I'd be happy to change the Wand Ban but changes in the definition of 'ownership' would be a much harder thing to bring about. (We haven't yet said outright that we're trying to overthrow the Lord Protector, or even that we're a "we", but Griphook's no idiot and our conversations have been full of careful hypotheticals on both ends.) He was listening, at least.

The one good thing is that I 'happened' to mention that it would suit my purposes if access to Strangeweale's vault was blocked after he died. We went back and forth on that one a bit, with Griphook arguing that if I wasn't prepared to say that goblin rules of inheritance applied to all goblin-made items, I couldn't ask them to not use human rules of inheritance for things humans put in their vault, but eventually we agreed that the presentation of the dagger was enough to trade for the Gringotts goblins blocking any attempts to open the vault for as long as possible, just this once. He said he can't guarantee forever, but he can definitely make sure it's a while.

So, more goblin artefacts to deliver as presents would help there, as well as wands or wand-lore -- if Melli is willing to teach them, that might be something we could trade for very high price. And, of course, once we overthrow His Noselessness, somebody has to make sure to put "removing the Wand Ban" on the priority list.
