Tomorrow, however, I expect we'll all rise early and apply ourselves to the work of preparing for the week to come. To that end, I <u>remind</u> you that you've a two part assignment to prepare, an assignment that begins with careful reading and then proceeds to thoughtful writing.

First, you are to closely read the first section (a mere 5 or 6 pages, depending on the translation) of *Intra profundis*, wherein you will find an elegant summary of the various branches of the Arts -- things like blood magic, binding magic, compulsion magic, disruptive elemental magic, magic to direct fortune or misfortune towards others, magic that impacts others in more direct or pronounced ways. The work dates from Roman times, so it will interest you to see where the differences and similarities lie between their understanding of these disciplines and our own. Remember that when I say you are to 'closely read', that means you are to engage the material until you understand it well enough to summarise it from memory and to answer questions about it.

Second, you must select one topic from those covered in the introduction that sounds interesting. Locate and read the section about that topic in the main body of the text. You must then write 12-15 inches in a reasonably-sized, legible hand (no less, but also no more) analyzing whether that practice would or would not be considered Dark by at least two of the definitions we discussed in lessons. I am not asking you to regurgitate <u>facts</u> about the type of magic, I am asking for your well-reasoned and well-articulated thoughts about how it would be classified under the definitions we have been discussing.

I trust you've already begun, as the total reading amounts to 20-25 pages and the time required for thought, analysis, planning, drafting

and perfecting the required essay will not be insignificant. In any case, I urge you to apply yourself to the task tomorrow. Do not deceive yourselves into thinking that you can cobble something together on the fly before lessons next week.

I'm pleased that the term is off to such a strong start, and I feel certain that you're as eager as I am to dig into our shared topic and explore it as fully and vigorously as we each are able. None of us wishes to get off on the wrong foot, surely.





Greengrass is the sort who always knows the right thing to say and is always looking to smooth over difficulties; if you are planning group or team work, she is a good choice to place in a group that cannot seem to get along. Bones is quietly capable; she will never be a frequent contributor in class, but when she does have something to add, it is usually insightful. Smith thinks more of himself than is warranted, but there are glimmers of hope in there, underneath the self-importance. I am certain Dunstan and Bundy must have some talents in Defence, having continued to NEWT study, but when I last taught them they both seemed frightened of their own shadows in my classroom. Bulstrode had promise in the Arts early in her OWL year, but it faded quickly.

Of the ones I most have my eye upon: Perks is all intellectual curiosity, about just about any topic you might imagine; I am encouraging her along the path to Healer study, as she's an interest in the topic and you know as well as I how much we could use one. Finch-Fletchley is on my very short list for apprenticeship, once S-P has finished her Mastery or I've the time to supervise two. Moon, meanwhile, is in frequent and desperate need of a reminder of reality, but the boy can make numbers sit up and dance: he ought not be trusted in public unsupervised, but he has the uncanny ability to sift through a mound of data and identify the patterns -- or the pieces that do not fit the patterns.

Oh, and this year was far more split by Umbridge's interference than the sixth-years: Patil, Finnigan, Macmillan, and Jones all had a tendency to lord their status over their fellows, for instance. They have all seemed to arrive at an unspoken agreement that they will not mention that year again, but the fault-lines are still visible if you know what you are looking for.

What could I have done better? I mistimed my spell against you. If I'd got it off half a second earlier, you'd have still been paying more attention to Smith and Bones. Or if I'd been able to cut it short and wait for

I don't think there were any tells before I cast, though. Or did you know before you asked Bones that question?

What could those around you have done better? Bulstrode should have waited until next lesson, probably. She was too anxious, and by the time she tried it, she was so wound up, she might as well have waved a red flag to warn everyone she was about to do something major. She expected to fail, too. Not a great way to launch an attack. That's why, when you'd parried it, she hadn't thought what to do next, she was just sulking about how it hadn't worked, just like she expected it wouldn't. So, she could have had a better plan for timing her spell, and she needed to have confidence in it or not bother casting, and she needed to know what she was going to do immediately after, and how she'd protect herself from there on.

What mistakes did you see? Li's wand work was shaky--maybe she was nervous--and Midgen just flat out had the wrong flourish at the end of her cast. Smith wanted us to think he was only half-trying, having a laugh about it, but really if you think you're not going to land a hit, you won't. Better to have waited. Goyle's technique was fine. Not good enough to catch you out, but his mistake was not thinking through what would happen afterwards: I mean, it was daft to jump in so early. Maybe he was aiming for the element of surprise, but he paid a high price for that bit of boldness, didn't he? I mean, we had nearly an hour to take it out on him.

But it might have made more sense to hex people closer to you, because their focus was more on you. It made me realise that the person moving is the most distracting.







What I wished to tell you is that I've learned a bit more about Healer Drubble. I inquired first of a colloague, who correct on the hospital's Standards





But maybe if we can just meet up from time to time without the pressure of our established social roles within the school, that would be a good starting place!



Practice space available

Sixth and seventh year students: Professor Desai and I have each had several of you ask about space and time to practise your duelling outside class. We've discussed the matter thoroughly, and have set up a duelling salle and training course in the east wing.



Obviously, student safety is a paramount concern. To that end, we have instituted a number of rules that must be followed for the use of the space:

— The space is thoroughly warded against casual admission. Professor Desai and I are both able to authorise passage through the wards. To be added to that list, you must briefly duel one of us. We'll be looking for both skill and a concern for safety.

— The salle will be available whenever you wish once you have earned the privilege of admission, and it is set up for both solo practice and paired or group training. You may use it as you'd like. However, you must come see me or Professor Desai for a brief report within 24 hours after each time you use the space, without exception: this is so we can check you over to make sure your practice has had no lingering effects.

— If you are sharing the space with one of your classmates, or with another professor, you must hold to standard training course etiquette to avoid clashing with each other's practice. If you are unfamiliar with course etiquette, you may ask one of your classmates who have more experience, or see me, Professor Desai, or Professor Sandoval-Pennifold for a tutorial.

— Both Professor Desai and I are happy to conduct training sessions, either individually or for small groups, for those who would like additional instruction. See us individually to make arrangements.

— If we determine you are training in a manner we consider unsafe or too risky, allowing admission to unauthorised students without our explicit permission, or in any way abusing the privilege of the use of the salle, we reserve the right to revoke your privilege of admission. Please see one of us if you have any questions, or to arrange an appointment for consideration for admission.
